CINCINNATI Oct 8—Beginning at 2 o'clock in the afternoon of Saturday, October 10th, the baseball teams of Chicago and Detroit, which have just won the closest recorded contest for the championship of the American and National leagues, will meet at Detroit to enter upon a six-day series of games for the baseball championship of the world. But one game will be played at Detroit before the scene shifts, Sunday and Monday contest being scheduled for Chicago, while the Tuesday and Wednesday games are to be played at Detroit, and the sixth game, or if one is necessary will then be transferred to Chicago. There have been some additional rules adopted governing such contests although in most respects the rules will be as previous years.

The National Baseball commission will be in charge but the immediate control of the games is given to two umpires from each league. For the National league Umpires O'Day and Klein were designated by President Pulliam while President Johnson of the American league named Sheridan and Connolly to represent his organization. The following details will govern the world's championship series. The certified checks of \$10,000 shall be deposited by each club with the secretary of the commission not later than 11 o'clock of the first day of the schedule and shall be thereupon by the secretary immediately placed in bank to the credit of the national commission. New Plays and Tactics to Be Used by Big Football Teams During the Present Season

PHILADELPHIA October 9—If the football season of 1908 does not produce several times as much novelty and science in the way of the new plays as any of its predecessors, it will not be the fault of the coaches and players who represent the Big Five. At every one of these institutions there has been shown a disposition to rush the season. Rudimentary knowledge of the game is not being ignored but it is being rushed along and made subsidiary to the strategic side of the game. That this is so is proven conclusively by the manner in which veteran players of former days have been flocking back to assist in building up new offensive tactics. It is doubtful if at any of the five institutions referred to here—Yale, Harvard, Princeton, Pennsylvania and Cornell—so much solid progress had been made within a single week. It is true that Cornell and Princeton entered the field later than their rivals, but with practice once started they have lost no time.

FORWARD PASS DOES IT The forward pass is certain to be productive of the most startling revolutions this fall. Without exception, all these coaches are working with it as the basis of their new plays. It has now been a part of the rules for two years but this time has been required to familiarize players with its basic principles. Its possibilities have not by any means been explored to their limit.

Wilbur Wright Makes Another Successful Flight in Airship

LE MANS October 8—Wilbur Wright the American aeronautist today made several flights which were witnessed by Dowager Queen Margherita of Italy and among his passengers were Lieutenant Colonel Baden Powell of the British army, Count Serge Kaznakoff, a chamberlain to the Russian emperor, Mrs. Belle and Commandant Boutinoux, director of the military aerostatic park at Le Mans. During these flights which were not of a very great length, Mr. Wright kept his machine comparatively close to the ground except the flight in which he earned Commandant Boutinoux, when he ascended to a height of 75 ft. Later Mr. Wright was presented to the Dowager Queen who warmly congratulated him. A public subscription has been open at Le Mans with the object of presenting a testimonial to Mr. Wright.
